FAMILY DRAWING COMPETITION: Rules of the Competition

Promoter

1. The promoter of the competition is the Scotland's Learning Partnership (SLP).

Purpose

2. The purpose of the competition is to promote drawing as a family activity, and to generate representations of Scottish families that can be used to promote adult and family learning. Entries will also be exhibited nationally.

Closing Date

3. The closing date is 5pm on Friday 18 September 2009.

Address for entries

4. All entries should be sent to the following postal address: Family Drawing Competition, Scotland's Learning Partnership, 22 Hill Street, Edinburgh EH2 3JZ

Eligibility and related entry conditions

5. The competition is open to all families living in Scotland.
6. The staff of and contractors to the Scotland's Learning Partnership and their direct family members are not eligible to enter the competition.
7. Entries must be submitted on a family basis.
8. Each family can submit up to 3 entries.
9. On entering this competition, families accept and agree to be bound by these rules.
10. Entrants must comply with these rules to be eligible for the prizes.
11. No responsibility can be accepted by SLP for fraudulent or ineligible entries.
12. Proof of postage cannot be accepted as proof of receipt. No responsibility can be accepted by SLP for entries that are lost, delayed or damaged in the post.
13. It is a condition of entry that entries submitted may be used or published by SLP without payment to any entrant for present and future purposes and without obtaining further permission.
14. SLP reserves the right to impose further conditions at the time any entry is being made.

Specification of composition of entries

15. All entries should be submitted on this official entry form.
16. All entry forms must have first name and surname, full address (including postcode) of each entrant completed for both family members. Telephone numbers and email addresses are optional.
17. Each entry should comprise up to two drawings, made by a family members from different generations (i.e. an entry from a brother and sister, or husband and wife, would be ineligible).
18. All entries must be original and the entrants' own and unaided work.

Decision

19. The entries will be judged by a panel selected by SLP. The judges' decision is final and no correspondence will be entered into.
20. There will be a maximum of 32 winners.
21. Winners will be contacted personally by letter after the closing date.
22. Entries will not be returned to the entrants.

Prizes

23. Each winning family will receive a family art kit.
24. Entries from winners and finalists will be exhibited nationally.
25. A list of the winners will be published on SLP's website.
26. No cash equivalent of the prizes will be offered.
27. Prizes are subject to change at the discretion of SLP.

Copyright

28. SLP owns the copyright of all entries submitted for the competition.

Publicity

29. SLP has the right to improve, edit, expand, modify, display and reproduce any entry, whether in print, on the internet, CD-Rom or by other media from the date of submission.
30. SLP has the right to use the name, age and region of the entrant which relates to any entry designed by that individual and is displayed or reproduced using any type of media. Written consent of the entrant will be required. If the child is under the age of 16 the written consent of the parents/guardians will be required.
31. SLP has the right to take or arrange to have taken photographs and to use photographs of the winners for promotion of, and publicity and marketing purposes of, adult and family learning. Photographs may be used in SLP publications and on the official SLP website. Written consent of the entrant will be required. If the child is under the age of 16 the written consent of the parents/guardians will be required.

Disqualification

32. SLP has the right to disqualify any entrant who breaches any of the above rules.

Jurisdiction

33. These rules are governed by the law of Scotland.
